



Safety Note: Carbon Monoxide Safety

Carbon Monoxide, "CO," is a dangerous, odorless, colorless gas that can be deadly if you are not aware of its dangers and taking actions to prevent poisoning. Below is information provided from the Office of the Illinois State Fire Marshal.

When it can be Found:

- CO can be found anytime you burn fuel from cars or trucks, small engines, stoves, lanterns, grills, fireplaces, gas ranges, or furnaces.

Symptoms of CO Poisoning:

- Headache, dizziness, weakness, upset stomach, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion
- "Flu-like" symptoms

Who is at Risk:

- Everyone is at risk.
- Infants, elderly, those with chronic heart disease, anemia, or breathing problems are more likely to get sick.

Some Prevention Tips:

- Install CO detectors within 15 feet of sleeping rooms
- Check and replace the battery each spring and fall





1947. In the chaotic aftermath of World War II, American college girl Charlie St. Clair is pregnant, unmarried, and on the verge of being thrown out of her very proper family. She's also nursing a desperate hope that her beloved cousin Rose, who disappeared in Nazi-occupied France during the war, might still be alive. **1915.** A year into the Great War, Eve Gardiner burns to join the fight against the Germans and unexpectedly gets her chance when she's recruited to work as a spy. Sent into enemy-occupied France, she's trained by the mesmerizing Lili, the "Queen of Spies", who manages a vast network of secret agents right under the enemy's nose. New Database

You will need your library card number to log in and create an account with your name and email address. There are thousands of videos to help you create almost anything. This is better than Pinterest or YouTube because the video is accompanied with written instructions and more.



After the Storm: Continue to check the weather, contact others, and check for any damages
