Local History

Last year, WPLM worked with Williamsville High School to collect all the yearbooks from the 1920's to present. The yearbooks were digitalized and are now available through the school district's website as well as the "History" tab at www.willamsvillelibrary.org. The history tab also provides access to local history interviews, including interviews with Sarah Benner, Charles Curry, Lee Miller and Wilbur Fawns. Valerie Patterson conducted the interviews several years ago, and the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum is preserving the audio files. The interviews have inspired a new effort to do video-recorded interviews with residents. The interviews will focus on families who owned former area businesses. The museum volunteers are currently reviewing binders in the genealogy room in order to consolidate information about the history of businesses in Williamsville, which will be the next local history display.

If you have friends and family who will be in town for Autumn on the Boulevard, or if you haven't seen the exhibits, you will have an extra opportunity to see the exhibits. WPLM will be open special hours on Friday, September 8, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Otherwise, feel free to visit Monday through Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. or Saturday 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Teen and Adult Crafting

They also attended the Springfield Civic Garden Club's Garden Tours. Five of their members showed their home gardens around the Springfield area.

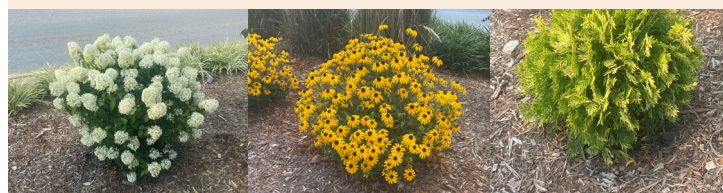
Garden Club Meetings

Regularly monthly meetings are usually held on the

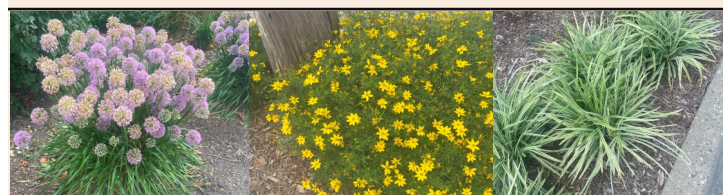

Fall Gardening Tips

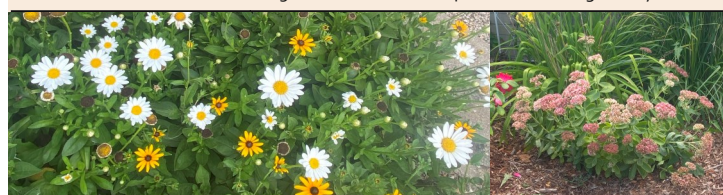

Bobo Panicle Hydrangea American Gold Rush Black-Eyed Susan Anna's Magic Ball Arborvitae

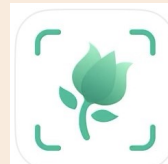

Anytime you are curious about a beautiful flower, plant, herb, shrub or tree, there is an app called PictureThis. It is a plant identifier app. All you have to do is take a picture and PictureThis will identify what it is and give plant care tips. It can even help with finding a cure for problems your plants might have.



Rose Care Tips

You can dead-head rose bushes by removing dead blooms, which can help them continue to bloom all summer. Also, try to only water the base of the plant. Try not to water the leaves, as the water can cause fungus to grow on them. If you notice your rose bush has leaves with holes in them, it is recommended to use Sevin powder on them.

Harvest Safety

As harvest approaches, you will start seeing more farm equipment on the roadways. The Illinois Farm Bureau and Illinois Department of Transportation gives these tips and warnings to motorists:

- Keep distance from the farm vehicle in front of you so that the driver can see you. If you cannot see them, they cannot see you.
- Be prepared to yield to wide equipment.
- Use caution when passing that the vehicle you are passing is not making a left turn. It is always illegal to pass in a "No Passing Zone", even when attempting to pass a slow moving vehicle.
- Always remember to be patient and share the road with our farmers.
